

Clinical Fellowship in Radiation Oncology

A one-year clinical fellowship position is offered at CancerCare Manitoba (CCMB) in partnership with the University of Manitoba commencing July of 2018. The Fellowship may be renewed for a second year.

The focus of this Fellowship is advanced clinical training in precision radiation therapy with training in Stereotactic Body Radiation Therapy (SBRT). In our center we offer SBRT for selected cases with lung, spine, liver and prostate cancers. About 40% of the Fellow's time would be protected for research and program development while the other 60% would be dedicated to obtain clinical experience in fields of mutual interest. There will be no after-hours call coverage. The Fellow will hold a PGY6-equivalent clinical position within the Department of Radiation Oncology with close collaboration with Thoracic, Urological and Gastrointestinal Oncology DSGs at CCMB. Opportunities for collaborative research projects in clinical outcomes, translational research, physics, and epidemiology are available and would be tailored to the interests of the successful candidate.

The Department of Radiation Oncology and CCMB Radiation Oncology Program reside in a state-of-the-art clinical outpatient and cancer research facility in Winnipeg on the Bio-Medical campus of the University of Manitoba. Equipment includes 7 Varian linear accelerators, high dose-rate and prostate brachytherapy suites, 2 simulators and a new orthovoltage unit. In addition to the use of IMRT, IGRT, Rapid Arc, Gamma Knife Perfexion SRS, and an integrated electronic medical record we have started treating patients using the state of art Edge Radiosurgery system from Varian Oncology in partnership with Winnipeg Regional Health Authority.

The Department of Radiation Oncology at CCMB sees approximately 3500 consultations per annum from Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario encompassing a population of 1.3 million. The Department presently has sixteen radiation oncologists, eleven medical physicists, and eight residents. Patients are seen within a multidisciplinary disease site group model.

Applicants should have completed training in Radiation Oncology prior to commencement of the Fellowship and be eligible for obtaining licensure from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba including the English language exam with qualifying score for international medical graduates.
