



Radiation Oncologist Central Alberta Cancer Centre, Red Deer, Alberta

CancerControl Alberta in conjunction with the University of Alberta, are seeking a **1.0 FTE Radiation Oncologist** to start by April 1, 2018 or sooner, to join the staff at the Central Alberta Cancer Centre (CACC) in Red Deer, Alberta. Demonstrated ability to manage patients with a wide range of disease sites will be an asset.

The CACC in Red Deer is one of four Regional Cancer Centres in Alberta. Serving patients from Central Alberta, the centre has 2 TrueBeam linear accelerators, CT planning and a full complement of medical physics, dosimetry, therapy and support services. A third vault is available to accommodate equipment renewal and future service expansion. You will be one of 2 Radiation Oncologists who in 2016 provided 493 new patient consultations and supervised 481 courses of external beam RT. Lung SBRT and recruitment to prospective clinical trials are part of daily practice. Cancer care provision at the CACC is centered around 7 major tumor groups with rarer tumors managed in conjunction with consultation and expertise from tertiary centers in Calgary and Edmonton. Regular tumor board and RT peer-review QA discussions occur locally and by videolink with either Calgary or Edmonton.

You will be expected to participate fully in a multidisciplinary approach to cancer care at the CACC and will join a team of Medical and Radiation Oncologists, Nurse Practitioners and medical support staff working in the Central Zone.

The CACC operates within a provincial framework for cancer care supported by provincial clinical guidelines and standards, focused on patient-centered care. Radiation Oncologists are expected to participate in local and provincial tumor team based activities including peer-review QA, annual, province-wide tumor team meetings, and local quality assurance or quality improvement initiatives and educational programs.

Red Deer is a city of 93,000 people located near the midpoint of the Calgary–Edmonton Corridor and surrounded by the rolling hills of the aspen parkland. Red Deer is a major centre for oil and agriculture distribution.

This picturesque, family oriented community boasts 80 kilometres of multi-use trails that permit biking, rollerblading, horseback riding, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing and, walking. The nearby Canyon ski resort is a favorite of snow boarders and down-hill skiers alike. Other attractions include the Enmax Centrium which hosts concerts, hockey, basketball, motor sports, ice shows, major curling events, circuses, boxing, rodeos, wrestling, trade shows and conventions. Red Deer is also home to a wide variety of cultural groups including the Central Alberta Theatre, Ignition Theatre and Central Music Festival.

The local school district serves 10,000 students in thirty schools, offering a wide range of programming from Pre-kindergarten to High School. École La Prairie, is a French school located in downtown Red Deer that offers pre-kindergarten through grade 9 programs. Red Deer College offers over 75 program options including degrees and University Transfer programs and award winning programs in Performing Arts.

The successful applicant will be expected to deliver excellent patient care and must be eligible for licensure in Alberta and must have obtained Fellowship in Radiation Oncology from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada by the time of appointment.
